ELOY UMC'S "LORD'S PANTRY" NEEDS OUR HELP

Eloy First United Methodist Church, with a church membership of approximately 30, began The Lord's Pantry in 2010 by providing food boxes to 35 families. In 2017, this congregation of 30 members expanded this ministry to 384 food boxes to 203-214 households feeding 900-1000 people every month. They are able to

continue this ministry to their small community northwest of Tucson with donations (monetary and food). They receive two food deliveries a month from the Mesa Food Bank for which they pay \$400 a month. In the Spring of 2017, Desert Southwest Conference sent out an urgent plea for immediate donations, and DSUMC responded quickly. When we delivered the food to them from our ELF Ministry cupboard at the end of their food distribution day, their shelves were bare.

The DSUMC 6th Annual September Food Drive to support The Lord's Pantry of Eloy UMC will take place from <u>September 9th – 30th</u>. They are requesting <u>cereal and peanut butter</u>. Please watch for sales of these items in the next few weeks so that we can "stuff the church van" on September 30th. Look for the table at the back of the sanctuary September 9th – 30th. DESERT SKIES CHOIR TO PERFORM AT CARNEGIE HALL

Our Desert Skies choir has been invited by **Manhattan Concert Productions** to join other qualified choral groups in performing the **Schumann Requiem at Carnegie Hall on June 17, 2019**. The invitation was received because a recording of our Easter Cantata was submitted to their audition committee without our knowledge. As a result, all members of our choir were invited, but not required to participate in order to accept the invitation. Twenty-two members of the choir and five non-singers are available to travel to **New York City June 14th to 18th**. The cost of accommodations, music and travel will be approximately \$2,100 per person.

Dr. Alex "Doc" Shawn has organized a Task Force of choir members and non-choir members to plan the logistics in preparing for the trip and to organize some fundraisers. Most of the choir members are paying their own way but there are a few who will need some financial assistance in order to go. The first fundraiser is listed below. What is an Emmaus Group?

The Walk to **Emmaus** is a three-day experience, a highly structured weekend, which takes a New Testament look at Christianity as a life-style. The program is designed to strengthen and renew the faith of Christian people and through them their families, congregations, and the world. Once you have completed your Walk to Emmaus, you find a group at your church and you meet once a week. It is an accountability group which includes some fun and fellowship.





Meet Gretchen Lokey, this week's Ben's Bells Project <u>#Bellee</u>! Sharon Olbert nominated Gretchen for her work with asylum seekers.

Gretchen runs the Inn Project, a program for sheltering asylum seekers who are brought to the shelter by Border Patrol. They are fleeing violence and are in transit to relatives or sponsors in other states. They are temporarily housed and fed and transported to the bus depot by volunteers. Gretchen provides a respectful and safe environment for these often frightened refugees. Congratulations, Gretchen. Desert Skies is happy to be one of the partners with The Inn Project.

THE INN PROJECT ALWAYS NEEDS SUPPLIES!

The Inn Project is a ministry of the UMC Desert Southwest Conference that temporarily shelters and cares for children and their families seeking asylum in the U.S. as they transition to the next part of their journeys. These families have already gone through Immigration and Customs Enforcement as well as Border Enforcement and are released to continue the immigration process. New families are constantly arriving and leaving so The Inn Project's needs are great and help is appreciated from anyone with an open heart.

Would You Like to Lend a Helping Hand?



The United Methodist Women have two groups who work on "Helping Hands". One group packs Hygiene Kits for five facilities here in town - Emerge, St. Luke's Home, TMM, Interfaith Community Services and Youth on Their Own. The other group packs 30 lunches on the second Tuesday of each month for homeless men at Primavera who will be going out to day jobs.

Volunteers from our church deliver the kits and lunches to the above locations the second Tuesday of each month. Barbara Drummond is in charge of the Hygiene Kits and Diana Barber the Primavera lunches. These two projects have been a part of the UMW Missions for almost twenty years.

Our UMW receives a generous donation from the Flea Market each year. A large portion of that is used to purchase the items for the Hygiene Kits. We encourage donations of food for the Primavera lunches and also use money from the Flea Market as needed. Items for the lunches that may be donated are: ham, turkey, cheese, bread, chips, fruit and cookies. Homemade cookies are a special treat for the men.

Some of the people who have helped with these projects are no longer able to do so. For this reason we are now looking for additional volunteers. We are especially in need of people who will be on a contact list to occasionally provide an item of food for the lunches or who would be willing to deliver the lunches and hygiene kits once or twice a year. The second Tuesday of each month at 9:00 a.m. is when the lunches are prepared and then delivered along with the hygiene kits. People willing to deliver would need to arrive at the church at about 9:30 a.m. Directions are available for our drivers.




UMW-ASPIRE



Dear Members and Friends of the Desert Southwest Conference,

Peace to you in the name and spirit of Jesus who calls us to live in faith, hope, and love!

The final report of the Commission on a Way Forward has been officially released to the public. The report is 93 pages long and contains the important background information (how we got to where we are) as well as the text of the plan (One Church Plan) that was supported by a large majority of the members of the Council of Bishops and the other two plans (Connectional Conference Plan and Traditional Plan) that were considered by the Commission on a Way Forward and the Council of Bishops. The English version of the report can be found <u>here</u>.

Reading through these plans is a time-consuming process, but by doing so, you will have a better sense of the nuances of the plans. I encourage you to read through them so that you will be informed about what the breadth of theological differences are in our United Methodist Church. However, let's also remember that numerous other proposals have been officially submitted for consideration by the Special Session of the General Conference in 2019. These, along with the plans included in the report of the Commission on a Way Forward, will be subject to debate and amending at General Conference 2019. Ultimately, what is adopted at General Conference may be dramatically different from any of these plans.

In order to better understand and prayerfully share our thoughts for our Church, I am inviting you to participate in a Holy Huddle on the Future of The United Methodist Church. The Holy Huddles will be helpful to us as we watch what happens in advance of and on the floor of General Conference. The Huddles being planned will consist of two parts. The first part, designed for clergy only, will focus on sharing ideas with the clergy of the Conference about how to lead our congregations with hope amid uncertainty with Christ-like respectful conversations and prayer.


The second part of the Holy Huddle will be for both laity and clergy together. The Holy Huddles are open to all persons who want to come and participate in Christian conversations about the future of our church. We will be hearing some background material to set the stage for our Huddles, but much of our time will be spent in conversation around tables, sharing our thoughts with one another. There will also be time for questions from individuals. All of this will be bathed in a prayerful, worshipful spirit and will include holy communion as the sacramental act which unifies us.

Some may ask why so much time is being devoted to these Holy Huddles. I believe we are in a very crucial moment in the history of our United Methodist Church and its predecessor bodies. Although we are not all able to vote on what plan is ultimately adopted by General Conference, we do have the responsibility to be aware of the implications of the plans. It is a privilege to pray and share around tables in Christ-like conversation. We join in expectation that our United Methodist Church will face the future united in hope for our future. I anticipate that we will be better prepared to continue our excellent ministries because we have these moments of Holy Huddle to inform and inspire us, centering us in the hope of Jesus Christ even as we undergo change. Our participation gives hope to our mission and ministry to all God's children in the name of Jesus.

I am looking forward to opportunities beginning this Fall to gather together as United Methodists in our Desert Southwest Conference as we discern God's wisdom for us. Our conversations at the Holy Huddles will be part of our step forward into the future for our United Methodist Church. You are an essential participant in that future so I hope you will be present with us!
