As you know, the Special Session of the General Conference of The United Methodist Church met in February and voted to adopt what is called The Traditional Plan, which keeps the language of exclusion of LGBTQI+ persons from marriage and ordination and further mandates a far more punitive response to clergy and laity who are ignoring that exclusion on the grounds of biblical obedience.

In June, your Church Council decided to hold conversations around the Desert Southwest Conference response, which disavowed the Traditional Plan, and out of these conversations has come a draft statement that we would like to **present for discussion** to the entire congregation, honing and revising it as we go. The timeline for development and adoption of a DSUMC Statement of Inclusion is below. We want **your feedback** as we move forward with our statement of who we are striving to be as a church. **Please speak to members of the Church Council on this topic or utilize the suggestion box located near the Kiosk if you would like to provide your feedback anonymously.**

Timeline for development and adoption of a Statement of Inclusion

Feb 23-26, 2019 - UMC Special Session of the General Conference - Traditional Plan adopted

Mar 2, 2019 - Called Together by Grace conference-wide meeting with Bishop Bob at St Paul's UMC

Mar/Apr 2019 - Weekly Lenten discussions at DSUMC about the issues surrounding GC2019

Jun 13-15, 2019 - Desert Southwest Annual Conference - Traditional Plan disavowed

Jun 25, 2019 - Church Council discussion of AC - Invitation to join DSC Way Forward teams

Jul 10, 2019 - DSUMC Called Anew to Follow discussion #1 - Initial draft of Statement of Inclusion

Jul 24, 2019 - DSUMC Called Anew to Follow discussion #2 - Second draft

Jul 30, 2019 - Church Council discussion of DRAFT Statement of Inclusion and vote to get feedback from the congregation at large

Aug-Sep 2019 - Discuss the DRAFT Statement of Inclusion with the congregation. We will hold several additional small group discussions. Members of Church Council will also be available for one-on-one conversations with members near and far to get as much input as possible. Our goal will be to refine the Statement of Inclusion based on all the input we gather before the September Council meeting.

Sep 24, 2019 - Present a refined draft of the Statement of Inclusion to Church Council seeking formal approval of the language to be presented to the Church Conference for a church-wide vote

About the Interfaith Community Services (ICS) Food Banks:

Last year, the ICS Food Banks served more than 32,000 children and adults and dispensed \$3.2 million of emergency food. Hours at the ICS Ina Road Food Bank are 9am - 1pm, Monday -Saturday and 5 pm to 7 pm on Tuesday evenings. The ICS Eastside Food Bank is open 10am - 1pm, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursdays and 10am - 1pm, the 1st and 3rd Saturday of each month. The ICS Food Bank is a pantry partner of the Community Food Bank of Southern Arizona and is the largest pantry distributor of emergency food in southern Arizona.
