### Desert Skies United Methodist Church Re-opening Plan

### Phase 1

In person worship remains suspended, online worship only.

Only those people essential to record service may be on campus, no more than 5.

Maintain protective measures-6 feet apart.

There will be no live singing.

All employees and volunteers will be encouraged to continue to work from home.

If it is necessary for employees or volunteers to be on campus-two or

three at a time, all protective measurers will be followed, including social distancing of 6 feet. All church buildings remain closed, including weddings and funerals.

Begin planning to implement Phase 2-guidelines in conference package.

#### Phase 2

### Online worship will continue. This will be our primary worship experience.

In person worship only for groups of less than 50, online worship will continue. Maximum social distancing and personal protection measures will be exercised.

All materials will be removed from the pews, no passing the plate, no greeters.

Masks will be required and will be provided to those who don't have them, there will be no Christ Café, there will be no physical contact.

All vulnerable individuals should continue to worship from home.

Food fellowship events will be avoided.

All employees and volunteers will be encouraged to continue to work from home.

Weddings and funerals may be conducted for groups of less than 50.

Conference guidelines for sanitizing will be followed and we will avoid food service. We will begin planning to implement Phase 3-guidelines in conference package.

### Phase 3

We will resume regular activities. We will continue online worship. All cleaning policies will remain in place.

# REOPENING COVENANT with and between DESERT SKIES UMC members during the COVID-19 pandemic

We the people of Desert Skies United Methodist Church covenant with one another to protect each other's health and safety and prevent the spread of COVID-19. In the spirit of John Wesley's proclamation of "Do no harm" and "Do good" and Jesus' call to love our neighbors as ourselves, we covenant to the following actions:

- To abide by the directives and guidance of the Bishop of the Desert Southwest Conference in reopening our church campus and offering in-person gatherings of any size.
- □ To refrain from attending any activities on the campus if we are ill with any signs or symptoms of the COVID-19 virus or have been among a group of 50 or more people in an enclosed area in the past 2 weeks.
- To wear a mask, maintain at least 6 foot physical distancing with other than family members, practice hand washing or use of hand sanitizer and avoid physical contact at all times when on campus, and to practice hand washing or hand sanitizer use when touching surfaces that may be touched by others.
- □ To graciously and patiently follow the directions of signs, trained staff and volunteers for safe distance leaving and returning to our cars as well as entering/exiting and safe distance seating even if it is not our "regular" door and seat.
- □ To refrain from serving food or beverage at any time or providing any activity that will encourage us to gather for unorganized socialization.
- □ To inform our guests of these measures in place for the health and safety of all on our campus and request their cooperation and compliance.
- □ To continue to support our church with our gifts as our expenses increase to make our campus safe and protected for our health.
- □ To continue these practices until the scientific and medical leaders and leaders in the Desert Southwest Conference all agree that we may safely gather without constraints.

# Our new worship series "Connecting the Dots" begins on Sunday, July 12th and runs through Sunday, August 30th.

Connecting the dots....a sort of shorthand phrase for making sense out of things that don't seem to make sense on the surface or at first glance. Jesus was a master at connecting the dots and he did his best as he

taught with "parables." The word for parable in Greek and Hebrew meant a variety of ways of speaking that used images to get hearers thinking. Scholar N. T. Wright said, "Jesus didn't tell parables to provide friendly little illustrations of abstract theology. He told parables because what he was doing was so different, so explosive, and so dangerous, that the only way he could talk about it was to use stories." Join us for our new series: Connecting the Dots, as we explore the radical nature of Jesus' stories and how they morphed from stories Jesus told to stories Jesus experienced, taking disciples of all generations on the journey with him.

### Stay-at-Home Stories by Theo Vandenberg

Theo Vandenberg is a woman who always has to have something to do and it's not a stretch to say that she found a project to keep her busy when a giant 400 yard "glob" of elastic arrived at her home from China. That's the length of four football fields! Theo divided the glob into six giant balls and got to work making masks. She stopped counting at 600 and polished off the last of the elastic by making masks with U of A fabric from some old curtains.

Theo's next project involved 5-gallon tubs of river rocks. Theo and her daughter picked out the round ones and painted colorful friendship rocks with words of encouragement such as *hope*, *love*, *forgive*, and *be well*. The collection now lives at a small park at the Tucson Medical Center where the patients and their families can enjoy them.

Theo's final project has turned her neighbors into bookworms. It's a large corrugated metal box that sits on the curbside by her home. Theo calls it her "Little Free Library" and it's filled with dozens of books and magazines, available for anyone to take home and read. Theo says it has proved to be a big success!


