In the last two months our Flea Market workers, who continue to sort weekly, and John Hokanson collected three bags of stuffed toys and a box of like-new toys for boys. Throughout Advent we have proclaimed hope, love, joy, and peace in the midst of difficulty. Our faith story is grounded in the presence of God that came and dwelt among us in the midst of hardship. And on the "longest night"—the Winter Solstice, we acknowledge the grief, loss, and deep disappointment we may also be experiencing during this season. The anticipation of renewed grief as Christmas Eve approaches can be difficult to bear for many. Ritual helps us move through these feelings and funnel our heartbreak in ways that, while not alleviating it totally, gives space for a tangible remembering. This will be especially important this year, because we often were not able to gather and ritualize our loss in the ways we usually do. For those attending in person, masks will be required, along with safe distancing protocols.

Missions/Social Concerns Committee

Missing the Shoebox Ministry???

Due to the COVID Pandemic there will not be a Shoebox Project this Christmas. However, your Mission Committee has organized two wonderful alternatives. We are assisting 20 families who are struggling during this very difficult time. The majority of these families are participants in our tutoring program and have attended youth groups, vacation bible school, music camp and other children's programs.

We are partnering with Safeway to provide 20 Christmas Turkey Dinners and with Rincon Rotary to provide grocery gift cards and Christmas presents. The Flea Market is providing furniture for two families transitioning from homeless status to independent living housing and members from our congregation have already adopted two families for Christmas gifts, trees and/or lights.

I realize that Christmas is almost upon us but there is still time to be part of this very special mission project. There are four main opportunities to participate.

- 1) Adopt a family by providing gifts that are specific to the needs and requests of each family member. We will get ages, sizes, gender and wish lists for each child and perhaps identify a special family item that can serve the household. We have families with 2 and up to 7 members in the home.
- 2) Donate money to the project.
- 3) Provide an individual gift or gifts specifically requested by a family or family member.
- 4) Help with shopping using already donated funds.

If we have more participation or donations than we need I will reach out to additional families or perhaps you might know of a family needing a little extra support.

A Friendly Reminder

The City of Tucson is providing wireless access to members of the community to support remote learning, telework, and access to virtual services. Due to funding limitations, the program **only has 5,000 routers** available for distribution. The applicant must:

- live in a coverage area
- be 18 or older as of October 31, 2020
- must have experienced financial hardship due directly to COVID
- You must have a household member who meets **one** of the following criteria:
 1. Is a **school age child or enrolled college student** who is remote schooling at least 1 day a week and requires internet connectivity
 2. Is 60 years of age or older
 3. Has a health condition that puts them in the COVID high risk category.

Applications will be processed starting on **December 9, 2020**. The application period will close on **December 21, 2020** and notification of application approval will go out to applicants during the week of December 31, 2020. Internet services will be available until **December 31, 2021** to those who qualify and are selected through an application process. This Community Wireless Program is paid for through funds received from the Federal CARES Act Coronavirus Relief Fund.

Their website is also live and has a lot of information on it regarding the program, eligibility, and the application process.

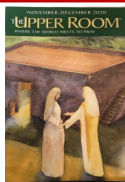
